



**University of Szeged, Albert Szent-Györgyi Medical School**  
**Regulations on the reduction of tuition fees**

The Council of the Albert Szent-Györgyi Medical School has framed its regulations on the reduction of the payment of tuition fees under the authority of section (4) of Article 31 of the Regulations of the University of Szeged on the fees and charges paid by the students and the means of financial support offered to them (henceforth referred to as SZTE Juttér).

The present document regulates matters not governed by the SZTE Juttér, and it is to be understood together with the SZTE Juttér.

The scope of regulations

1. Falling within the scope of the present regulations are students partaking in the single-cycle medical program, irrespective of the language of instruction or the mode of financing their studies; students partaking in the translator and interpreter postgraduate training for health sciences program and the postgraduate communicator training in English for health sciences program; as well as students partaking in the scientific editor postgraduate training program.

The means of submitting requests

1. Putting in a request addressed to the Academic Board of the School for a reduction of the tuition fee is possible 15 days prior to the payment deadline at the latest through the Modulo system. The Academic Board evaluates the request submitted within 8 working days. Students can lodge an appeal against the decision with the Dean of the School within 15 calendar days starting from the day the decision was available to the student by submitting the request to the Academic Office. The Dean evaluates the appeal within 8 working days.

Procedures applicable upon establishing or changing the student status

1. Students admitted to the first year, students readmitted to the program, or students who have transferred to the School from another university can only ask for a reduction of their tuition fees after they have completed two active semesters within their current training.

2. According to 6.3 and 6.4 of the Academic and Examination Regulations of the University of Szeged, students are entitled for a full refund of their tuition fees in case they put in a request for a passive semester or the suspension or termination of their studies by the end of the course registration period of the semester concerned.



3. A 50% tuition fee refund is available for students submitting the above request until October 15 in the first semester and March 15 in the second semester. No refund is possible if requests are submitted after the deadlines above.

#### The types and extent of possible reductions

The Academic Board of the Albert Szent-Györgyi Medical School can grant a maximum of a 50% reduction of tuition fees.

1. After having completed two active semesters within his/her current training, a maximum of a 50% reduction of the tuition fee can be granted upon the student's request provided that s/he is taking/is required to retake one or two compulsory subjects within. In such a case, the tuition fee to be paid includes the possibility for students to add an unrestricted number of elective/compulsory elective/formerly criteria subjects and a maximum of two examination courses.

2. A maximum of a 50% reduction of the tuition fee can be requested by students who satisfy the conditions set forth in section 3.1 and who are required to retake a subject or subjects, and who are solely taking a subject or subjects that do not involve class attendance (preliminary examination, examination course) in the semester concerned.

3. The board members of HÖK, ISUS and SZOE (president, vice-president—a maximum of 5 individuals), concerning the successful completion of their leadership tasks, may request a maximum of a 20% reduction of their tuition fee. The amount of tuition fee reduction provided to the above members, however, cannot altogether exceed 50%, which is determined as the maximum amount of reduction.

4. Those state-financed students who have exhausted the number of state-financed semesters available to them (a maximum of 14) and were consequently classed to a self-financed status may also request a maximum of a 50% reduction of their tuition fee. The study results achieved by the student in the last 2 active semesters within his/her current training he or she has completed have to be taken into consideration, while his/her social situation can be taken into consideration. Requests are evaluated using evaluation criteria pre-determined by the Academic Board.

#### Validity

The regulations in the present document take effect from the 2026/2027 academic year, pursuant to Faculty Council resolution 102/2025-2026. (III.24) sz. SZAOK K.T. sz.
