This Data Processing Information is a summary of the information you need to know about how we will use and safeguard your personal data under the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) during our Medical Alumni Reunion 2025 event.

1. Who can you turn to?

The University of Szeged is the data controller for the data processing of the Medical Alumni Reunion 2025 event, but the actual data processing is done through the following organizational unit.

2. What are the main legal rules?

We inform you that your personal data will be processed in compliance with

- Regulation (EU) 2016/679 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 27 April 2016 on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data, and repealing Directive 95/46/EC (GDPR), and
- Act CXII of 2011 (Hungary) on the right of informational self-determination and freedom of information (Freedom of Information Act).

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4. What data processing are we implementing?

The following data processings take place related to the Medical Alumni Reunion 2025 between the 3rd and 5th of October 2025.

- 1. Registration as participant to the event
- 2. Image and video recording
- **4.1.** Registration as participant to the event

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4.2. Image and video recording

We inform you that we take image and video recording of the program, in the form of a crowd and in connection with public performance, as well as individualized recordings.

We inform you that the CME session on 3rd October, 2025 will be streamed on the official media platforms of the Albert Szent-Györgyi Medical School.

Data processing related to recording of a crowd, public performance and individualized recordings

Pursuant to Section 2:48 (2) of Act V of 2013 on the Civil Code (hereinafter referred to as the Civil Code), in the case of a crowd and in connection with public performance, the consent of the data subject is not required for either the preparation of the recording or its use. However, data subjects must be informed in advance in such cases as well, therefore we comply with our prior information obligation with this Data Processing Information and by placing a notice on site stating "We would like to inform you that images and audio recordings (video recordings) will be made during this event."

As the University of Szeged is dedicated to the protection and safety of all kinds of personal data, and the respect of privacy, we inform you that we use these recordings (recording of a crowd or public performance, individualized recordings) to promote the university and for marketing purposes through the online and offline channels of the University of Szeged.

We inform you that you have the right to object to the recordings of a crowd or public performance, individualized recordings

- before the program through the contact person, and
 - at the program venue, notifying it for the event organizers

so that the organizers can most effectively resolve not to include you in the recording.

We collect the following information for identification when entering the voluntary consent.

In all cases, we request consent from the person concerned for the preparation and use of individualized recordings pursuant to Section 2:48 (1) on the Civil Code. When providing voluntary consent, we collect the following data for identification purposes.

Voluntary consent may be withdrawn at any time. We inform you that the withdrawal of consent shall not affect the lawfulness of processing before the withdrawal. In the erasure request, we will ask you for the same information as you used to give consent (cf. table above).

The required data will be stored for a maximum of 30 days until the withdrawal (erasure) of the voluntary consent is completed. After that time, we will no longer store the revoked personal data or the erasure request.

5. Who can get to know your personal data?

In connection with the Medical Alumni Reunion 2025 your personal data may be disclosed to the data controller organizational unit mentioned in point 1 of this Data Processing Information sheet, as well as to those to whom your personal data is given over or transferred (jointly: recipients).

5.1. Giving over of data within the organization



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We do not give over data within the organization.

5.2. Transfer of data outside the organization

We do not transfer data either inland or abroad.

5.3. Do we resort to a data processor?

We do not resort to a data processor.

6. Do we collect personal data about you from another source?

No. We collect the personal data about you from you, and do not collect data from other sources.

7. Is there an automated decision making during data processing?

No.

8. What are the legal consequences for non-disclosure?

If you do not consent to the data processing, you may not be allowed to attend the event.

However, there will be no adverse legal consequence for not providing the data.

9. What legitimate interests do we have in our data processing?

Our data processing is not based on legitimate interest, our data processing is based on other legal bases.

10. What rights do you have?

As a data subject, you have the rights:

1. right to be informed – you have the right to ask for information on the processing of your personal data. We ensure your right to be informed by preparing and publishing this Data Processing Information.

2. right of access – you have the right to request personal information and a copy of the personal data we handle.

3. right to rectification - if you notice inaccuracies in your personal data that we process, you have the right to request correction.



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4. the right to withdraw voluntary consent - the voluntary consent can be withdrawn at any time. We would like to inform you that the withdrawal of consent does not affect the legality of data processing before the withdrawal.

5. right to erasure – following the objection when the processing of data is based on voluntary consent and there is no other legal basis for data processing, then you can ask for the erasure of your personal data.

6. right to restrict processing – you have the right to ask for the restriction of the processing of your personal data, for example after you find inaccuracies in your personal data, you can ask for restriction of processing while the data controller is checking the data, or exercise of legal claim.

7. right to legal remedy – every data subject has the right to legal remedy in case of an infringement.
